"Calling 9-1-1 in an Emergency"

Translators: Translate only the words not "number 1, number 2, number 3". Please contact Larry Bogoslaw with any questions. Good luck with your work!

Number 1: When you see flashing lights on police cars, fire trucks, ambulances or tow trucks in front of you, move over a lane [= move to an adjacent lane] or reduce your speed.

Number 2: Call 9-1-1 only when you see or are involved in an emergency.

Number 3: When calling 9-1-1, stay calm, be ready to tell the dispatcher the type of emergency and your location, and do not hang up. [another way to say this: stay on the line until you answer all the dispatcher's questions, including the type of emergency and your location.]
