#1 Keep Your Distance	-8-

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Video: fencing or physical barrier (No admittance sign) Video: exclusion signage (no trespassing) (visitors report to office) (no entry) (authorized personnel only) Video: Hand washing Protective clothing Video: Pan from public areas to secure areas.	First: "Keep your distance." For these brief directions (#1-#6), please translate the whole paragraph first, then LATER write a "key phrase" to put above them in quotation marks. Keep people away from your birds, because they may bring in disease and not know it. Also, wear clean clothes when you work with your birds and wash your hands before and after working with the birds so you don't spread disease. If birds
	are kept outdoors, provide food and water in an indoor area. [NOT inside your house, but in a structure like a shed or chicken coop.]
